Safety is important when it snows! Snow can be slippery, so walk and drive carefully. If you are going to have fun, you must be safe!

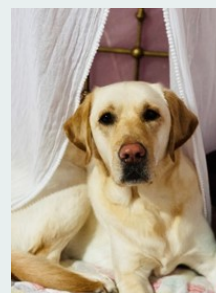

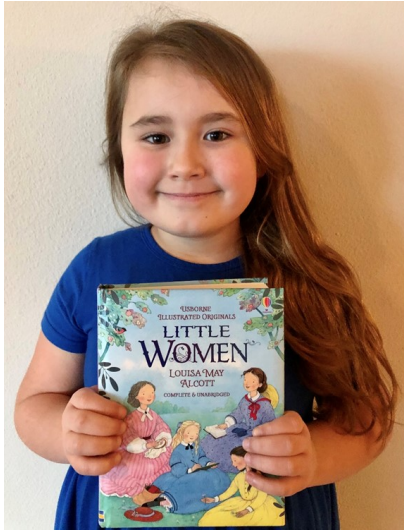

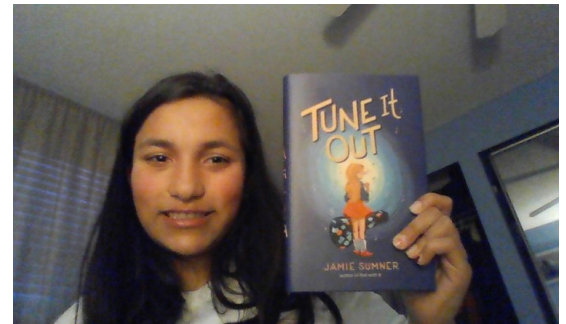
Book Review: Tune It Out

ZONES OF REGULATION




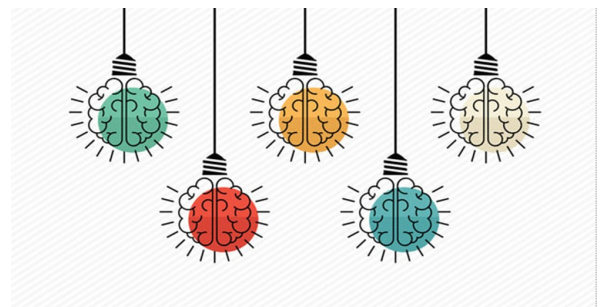

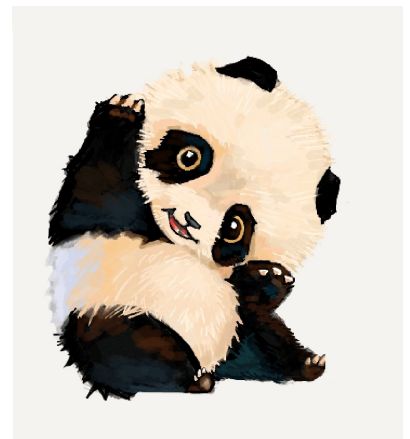
